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Be Involved

Students whose parents are involved in their education earn higher grades and test scores and enroll in higher-level programs, attend school regularly, have better social skills, show improved behavior, adapt well in school and graduate and go on to postsecondary schools.

Play-Learn-Grow

Children learn best in an environment which allows them to explore, discover and play. Children actively involved in play may be engaged in a variety of activities, independently, with a partner or in a group. Because play is closely tied to the cognitive, socio-emotional and motor development of young children, it is an important part of developmentally appropriate childhood programs.

- Experiences with blocks help young children's growing knowledge in math, literacy and science. When young children play with blocks they are having hands-on experiences with concepts like fractions, construction and gravity as well as creative thinking.
- Puzzles help young children use the muscles in their fingers, hands and wrists. As children look at the pictures on pieces, they develop their visual perception skills.
